

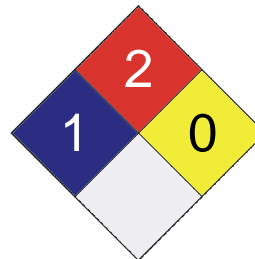

4. First Aid Measures

First aid procedures
